“The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not want.”

We all recognize those familiar words from Psalm 23 of the King James Version

(KJV) of the Bible. It is amazing that those words were first published 400 years ago, on May 2, 1611, yet the KJV continues to impact the English language and the Christian church.

I hope you will join us this Sunday night as we honor the rich heritage of the KJV with a special celebration service that will include scripture readings, music, and stories about the translation of the Bible into English.

Many people are unaware that at the time the KJV was published, Puritans preferred the Geneva Bible of 1560, and Anglicans preferred the Bishops Bible of 1568. It took 30 years for the Puritans to accept the “new” translation that was commissioned by King James of England. Many also are unaware that the KJV has been revised several times, and the KJV Bibles you buy today were revised in 1769. For example, in 1611, Psalm 23:5 said, “...thou anointest my head with oyle; my cuppe runneth over.”

This should be a reminder to all of us that while God’s word does not change, from time to time new translations are needed, as our language changes. Even the popular New International Version (NIV) has undergone a revision in 2011.

What caused the KJV to have an enduring influence, even after four centuries? It was the first translation done by a committee of expert scholars, and they gave great attention to how it sounded when read aloud. But the greatest reason of all is that it is a faithful translation of God’s Word. “The grass withereth, the flower fadeth: but the word of our God shall stand for ever” (Isaiah 40:8, KJV).

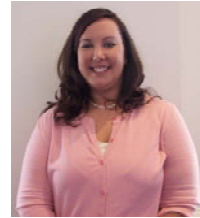
As we celebrate this great Bible translation, may we renew our commitment to read and study God’s word, whichever translation we use.

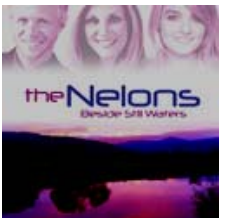
